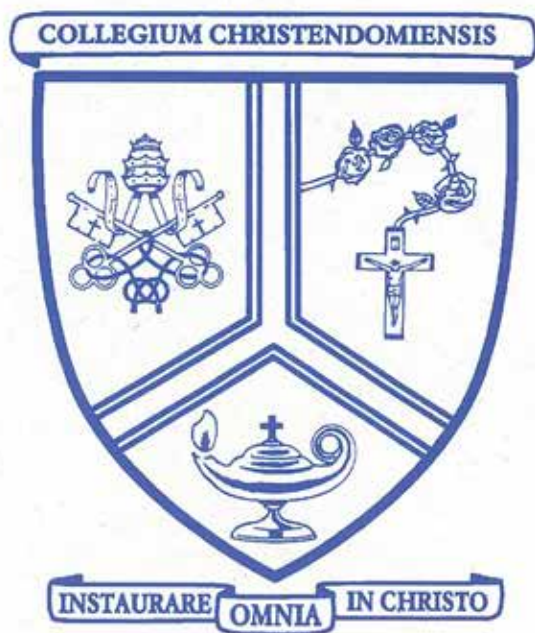

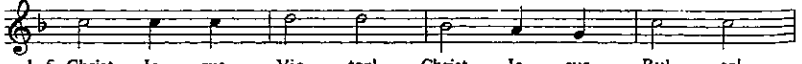

*His Eminence Alfonso Cardinal López Trujillo*  
*Recipient of the Christendom College Degree,*  
*Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa*

His Eminence Alfonso Cardinal López Trujillo was born in Villahermosa (Tolima), Colombia, on November 8, 1935. He was ordained a priest on November 13, 1960, appointed Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Bogotá on March 25, 1972, appointed Coadjutor Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Medellín on May 22, 1978, and Archbishop of Medellín from 1979 to 1991. His Eminence was elected Cardinal in the Consistory of February 2, 1983.

He concluded his studies in Spiritual Theology at the Teresianum Institute and earned the doctorate in Philosophy from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. Cardinal Trujillo has been a professor of philosophy, psychology, and patristics, teaching at the Major Seminary of Bogotá, the National University of Colombia, and at I.D.E.S. and Pedagogic University of Bogotá. He has been awarded *Honoris Causa* doctorates from numerous universities.

Other positions included Coordinator of the Theological Reflection Team for the Latin-American Episcopate (CELAM) from 1968 to 1972, Secretary General of CELAM from 1972 to 1979, President of the Doctrinal Commission of the Colombian Episcopate, Secretary General of the Puebla Conference (Mexico), and President of the Colombian Episcopal Conference from 1987 to 1990. Since November 8, 1990, he has been holding the office of President of the Pontifical Council for the Family in Rome.

His Eminence has served as a member of the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, the General Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops, the Pontifical Council for Dialogue with Non-Believers, Pontifical Council *Cor Unum*, Pontifical Council for Social Communications, Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People, and the Pontifical Commission for Vatican City State.

At present Cardinal Trujillo is a member of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, the Congregation for Bishops, the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, and the Pontifical Commission for Latin America.

Cardinal Trujillo is the author of more than a dozen books, including *The Family: Gift and Commitment*, *Hope for Humanity* (Città Nuova, 1997), and is a contributor to numerous magazines and journals.
